


Planning for the Future PERMITTED SURCHARGE TESTING STARTING SOON

build. Our soil studies have given

development process is to validate
those studies by performing
different field tests. The first will
be a surcharge test.







What is Surcharging? ———

Surcharging involves adding a heavy layer of sand over an area. The weight of the sand squeezes out water and packs down the soil. Surcharging creates a sturdier foundation. This is a proven process that helps the ground settle faster.


Surcharge Test Timeline ———

Port NOLA will begin the surcharge testing process on two small areas of the proposed terminal site in May. The majority of the site work for this is anticipated to last ten months.






Test Sites
